### **Question 6: Comments about communication and league organization**

We applaud you for having tryouts that actually tests players ability, and not just have the players throw and field the ball for 5 min.

We also like that the league didn't simply put all the beginning players on one team and have a parent with no knowledge of the game and no coaching experience be allowed to coach a team, (which is what we experienced at Wai-Kahala!) Needless to say, it was a waste of time and energy!

The much improved and re-vamped communication system via e-mail is greatly appreciated. Information is frequently being shared and disseminated which makes for a stronger league.

Why are HKYB league fees more than the other two leagues in the area ( KAC and Wai-Kahala )? What are the fees being used for?

### ***Question 7: Comments about the coaching***

When I contacted the coach by e mail it was not a very good response to my concerns.

My son really enjoyed his coaches and started to just love playing baseball. The coaches this year taught him so much and really worked with him to become a better player.

One of Coach Chad's 2 teams did not have any catchers equipment provided.

We loved the fact that our coach was very knowledgeable about the game and knew how to coach. We were in Wai-kahala, and had 2 separate coaches, who either did not know how to coach, and/or did not know the game. It was a waste of time and energy for us.

We have been fortunate to be on teams with veteran coaches who teach more than baseball skills but also emphasize sportsmanship and having FUN!

Coaches really make a big difference. My son's recent season had a great coach, while his first experience with a team wasn't very good due to the coaches.

Coach DJ Smith is a dedicated & inspiring coach. He had extra practices to teach the boys the basics and was always available. He was tough with the boys and had high expectations for them which in turn pushed my son to excel. At the same time, the boys learned good sportsmanship and how to have fun (even when they lost games).
